Paid off back taxes, will be covered by Heather.

Julie Dring introduces herself as new ED; gives brief CV; notes changes in core staff; opening announced for communications and outreach co-ordinator COC; acknowledges interns and volunteers; acknowledges members as volunteers, donors etc.

8. Programming Director's Report

Abedar Kamgari presents. Says hello to the gathered. Recounts involvement. Thanks to all involved. Excited about "the incoming project" especially for immigrant artists; free workshops, for folks who have practicing art careers; all free, commences this week (early December); annual CFS: currently every Fall, deadline Dec. 17; call fro courtyard, internal gallery, youth, and vulnerable pop's; all paid position. Invites gathered to apply, or to encourage others to apply.

9. Committee Reports

9.1 Programming

Bojana Videcanic presents. Greets gathered. Programming committee chair as of 2017. Has been a step hill; lots to learn. Grateful to Dana G. Cara B. Abedar and others. Big things happened, staff changes. Impacted working committees. Abedar's "coming on" was seamless, amazing commitment, has gone above and beyond, wants to acknowledge Abedar. B's role was to support Abedar, did this throughout the year. Urges diversification of programming; part of the strategic plan.

9.2 Special Events and Fundraising

Mark Prier reporst. Special events & fundraising. a busy year. Cut spring craft mart, it was becoming too much work for staff. No way to implement the spring mart, declining interest. Things are becoming a smoother, well-oiled machine. SWARM is the last thing that happens each year; things have gone to plan; Kaylyn Roloson is a co-chair; thanks committee members.



9.3 Development

Chris McLeod reports. New to board. Trying to get sponsorship packages together; thanks to Brian; looking at corporate member/sponsorship; change language; advertising; very early on; tonight, tags on the walls tell potential donors what their gifts will be helping with; a call for funding support for new computers.

9.4 Communications and Membership Outreach

Mary reports. Thanks to Karen Schulman Dupuis and Kelly Drennan. both stepped off the board this year; lots going on. (Not sure what this committee is called?). COC was created (BYPOC?). New ways to communicate, a role filled by Sonali. S. came on in the summer, did an excellent job, worked on social media; decided to step out of that position, to work on other projects. Urges gathered to contribute to help finding a new COC.

9.5 Facilities

David Perret reports. The roof is a big problem; a trillium grant has been applied for. Urges gathered to refer flat roofers. Minor repairs to electrical outlets. Upcoming: track lighting needs to be replaced in three years. All else in good shape.

9.6 NEW Committee

Taien Ng-Chan reports. Identifies herself as liaison b/t committee and board, pushing for diversity; glad to see this progress. Acknowledges COBRA (?) meeting here at INC. HCFCI strata conference; reads off list of presenters; Capacity Grant authored; upcoming collab. artwork, with Centre 3; on outside wall. Call for new members to join this committee.

10. Financial Report

10.1 Presentation of 2017/18Audited Financial Statements

Heather Kanabe presents. Indicates figures on slide; P&L incoming; net income is slightly higher as stated, ahead on property tax. \$2000 higher. Actuals indicated: auditor's stmnt- board is accountable; sufficiency explained; cash donations; Note to draft stmnts; \$14,000 difference in revenue b/t ... Cash looks good b/c of CC grant; indicates p.5 for details; AP lower than previous years; no property taxes payable (applause); deferred rev higher; CPG incoming; Insight grant; CC Grant Jan-December; OAC grant. Deferred rev's p. 8 in stmnts; error: no CHEF - not present; acc. Surplus has increased closer to \$69000 (too high); need to bring this down; e.g. roof expense; planning for 13,000 deficit for the coming year; income stmnt: grants are higher, will be higher stated closer to \$135000; GRANTS/REV BREAKDOWN P.10: CHG outstanding receivable \$11400 should not have been deferred; CHG should be \$57000; income stmnt:



fundraising income increased 10%, from Bingo rev. \$24000 from city; \$2000 from other activities; donation have increased; rental income has increased by \$10000; resulting from large contracts from production companies; wish to continue this practice; general increase across the board; expenses: administrative and exhibition expenses have increased; due to obligations to CCG; refers to tables and chairs acquisitions to facilitate rentals; property tax is current: the amount will look higher this year; a question about professional fees: not doubled. Auditor has "put" allocated professional fees: not sure. Salaries increased significantly; on par; pay to be slightly more competitive; overtime hours incurred; support staff etc. Outreach co-ord. was compensated. After amortization, net income is \$18179, plan for a deficit next year. Gaps in salary pay. Q. about surpluses expected. H. replies this is a one-time surplus.

My name is Adrienne Crossman and I am applying to be a member of the Hamilton Artists Inc Board.

I am an interdisciplinary artist, educator, and curator with a specialization in digital media and installation art. I possess a strong foundational knowledge of critical theory and contemporary art and I have several years of experience working within art institutions and artist-run-centres in the GTA and Southern Ontario. I hold a Bachelor of Fine Arts from OCAD University in Integrated Media (2012), with a minor in Digital and Media Studies, and a Master of Fine Arts in Visual Arts from the University of Windsor (2018).

My studio practice combines video, sculpture, installation and light-based work to create affective queer environments. My practice has largely focused on the spaces that exist in between binaries such as male/female, virtual/physical, synthetic/real, and I'm interested in how the terms trans* and non-binary apply to media as well as gender. My work investigates the ways in which media and popular culture representations both mirror and influence contemporary society, specifically in relation to how they shape the ways we see the world in addition to how we see ourselves.

From 2013 to 2016 I held the position of Programming Coordinator at Xpace Cultural Centre, where I coordinated with artists, curators and writers in the planning and facilitation of workshops, exhibitions and events. I supervised and mentored student interns, gave class talks, and advised students about professional development, providing feedback on studio work and gallery submissions. I worked closely with OCAD students and alumni as well with the OCAD Student Union to support and foster emerging creative practices within an anti-colonial and anti-oppressive mandate. I have also been involved with several other artist run centres, most recently Artcite in Windsor where I was a member of the Board and Chair of the Programming Committee. I have curatorial, administrative and installation experience and feel that I would be a great asset to the Hamilton Artists Inc. Board.

As a new Hamilton resident, I feel it important to contribute to the local art community and I am very much in agreement and support of the Inc's mandate and vision. Since volunteering with the Inc I have made several great connections and have enjoyed lending my time to help with events and exhibitions. As a board member I look forward to continuing to be involved in a more significant capacity.
